Ideally, the piece is performed by a MIDI-controlled piano; if that's unavailable, and MIDI piano is employed to make a recording (broadcast, etc.), try to make sure the best available samples are used, so as to not fatigue the ear (taking into account the piece's duration of some 10 minutes).

Most of the earlier studies for MIDI-controlled piano required performer input: the precise handling of arpeggi, the exact tempi and rates of acceleration/deceleration, etc. were all left for the performer (programmer) to adjust as they saw fit. In *Study* V, everything is to be played as indicated in the score, but if desired (and especially if samples are used), dynamics can be adjusted in longer sections without dynamic indications (e.g. bars 19 to 32), and – only if absolutely necessary – elsewhere.

This work is a satellite piece of *Star Colors*, an earlier work for solo piano. Bars 1 to 68 are taken verbatim from its seventh movement, *Lavender*, and the rest of the piece is constructed using the same procedure and the same materials as *Lavender*.
